The bike on display was MSG Entrichel's pride and joy.

His last wish was that this bike be handed down to another Special Forces soldier who would appreciate it for what it represents. His last wish was fulfilled by Chapter 40, Special Forces Association, located in Tampa, Fl. (Pres. Jay F. Lovelace) in a raffle in which all funds generated were donated to St. Jude's Children's Home in Memphis, TN in E-Tool's name.

The scenes painted on the bike represent Special Forces soldiers and the high ideals which they ascribe to. Many of the scenes depict his personal experiences while in Vietnam. He served two tours of eighteen months each with Operational 'A' Detachments. The exact years of his service in Vietnam are painted on the front bumper of the bike.

MSG Entrichel completed his Special Forces training at Ft. Bragg, NC and served with the 5th SF Group in Vietnam, 7th SF Group in Ft Bragg and Panama, 10th SF Group in Ft. Devens, MA and Bad Tolz, Germany.

"E-Tool" was his trademark. This was an affectionate and enduring name given to him by fellow 'Green Berets' and became his moniker.

MSG Entrichel was the EPITOME of what a Special Forces soldier should be. He never passed an opportunity to place himself in harm's way. He loved his family, his Country and Special Forces. He will be missed –
